On Tuesday morning we had some visitors from St Luke's who wanted to see what we did and explore how they might like to be involved. Perhaps some of them will come along to our regular Tuesday morning sessions and workshops, or we may look at something different for them.

We had a lot more produce to pick on Tuesday including our large funny shaped tomato, a variety of other tomatoes, cucumber and zucchini.

Mr Forbes' VCAL students are getting ready to put in new posts to make the compost bays higher, and to build a holding bay between the compost bays and the gate. When the work is finished behind the year 9 complex we will be able to get more dirt delivered so we can finish off the remaining wicking beds and get them planted.
